CONNECT SENIORS TO WELLNESS WORKSHOPS

EMERGENCEY PREPAREDNESS: The DOS is currently working on the Community Emergency Plan; with the intention to provide seniors with information to help them to prepare their home and themselves should an emergency occur.

MENTAL HEALTH: SCCS AND DOS will collaborate with the Canadian Mental Health Association to bring an interactive mental health workshop to Stewart. The workshop will focus on senior mental health and aging in a rural community.

LIVING WITH CHRONIC ILLNESS: Our Healthy Communities Liaison for Northern Health will assist in planning the workshop and participate if available.

HEALTHY EATING: Efforts will be made to bring a dietician and resources to Stewart, allowing our seniors the opportunity to learn in a group, from each other and one-to-one with the dietician.

February 18th, 2025, marks the 60th Anniversary of the Granduc Mine Slide Tragedy. On this day, in 1965 at 10:16am an avalanche struck the mining camp, killing 26 men. This devastating event is an important part of both Stewart's history and the history of the mining industry as a whole. Twenty-six men lost their lives and twenty-six families lost their father, husband, son, brother, uncle, and more. The District of Stewart and the Stewart Museum/Stewart Historical Society are hosting an event at Al Lawrence Memorial Arena to commemorate the 60th anniversary of this tragic part of Stewart's past. All residents are welcome and encouraged to attend. The event will occur over two days, beginning on the evening of February 17th and continuing throughout the day on February 18th.
