THE DISTRICT OF STEWART is currently seeking applications for a Heavy Equipment Operator for a two month term to assist with winter operations:

Duties:

Under the direction of the Public Works Manager, the Heavy Equipment Operator is responsible for the safe and efficient operation of heavy mobile equipment (Graders, Loaders, Plow Trucks, etc.) for the purposes of snow removal from roads and around District buildings as well as the performance of manual duties such as: snow removal, sidewalk clearing, drainage ditch maintenance, and other duties as assigned.

Requirements:

- Applicants must be able to legally work in Canada and over 18;
- Minimum Class 3 Driver's Licence with air brakes endorsement; preference will be given to those with a Class 1 Driver's Licence;
- Grade 12 Education or equivalent;
- Minimum of two years experience in the operation of heavy equipment for the purposes of snow removal;
- Proven ability to follow direction, and self motivation to finish tasks and address what needs attention;
- Safe work practices and excellent teamwork skills;
- Experience with public works functions, including roads, water, wastewater and municipal operations considered an asset;
- Experience with the use and maintenance of public works tools and equipment
